I note all aspects of the programme for the National Planning Framework, however I would wish to seek to have some consideration given to better provision regarding rural transport and for consideration to be made for better inter region road infrastructure in particular the R700 via Kilkenny and up into the midlands and the R704 from New Ross, Co.Wexford which services the M9 and on towards Dublin and interconnector options.

For the area to develop economically, including Kilkenny, Wexford, Waterford, Carlow and Tipperary Waterford regional airport will need upgrading regarding runways and terminal provision.

Regarding Broadband, while there is a plan in place to cover countrywide it would seem that by 2040 the existing network will be greatly at a weak connection speed and so to this end the plan for broadband, and perhaps more high speed and technical communications should seek to be in line with other nations thus allowing for better work practices, both in the work place and from the home.
